




The major takeaway for me during this Pandemic has been the thought of adaptability. All of us are experiencing a reality that none of us anticipated. Even after the discovery of this Virus, no one ever that it would last for this duration. Even now, with the rollout of the vaccine we still don't have a date for when we might return to some normalcy. so, we are now foreced into a new reality causing us to reassess how we live our everyday lives. In being a pastor for some 41 years, I have lived a very routine driven life with everything leading up to Sunday morning worship service. 
